# Fourteenth Report

#### **APRIL 2023**

Since publication of its Thirteenth Report (Hudon et al. 2021), the Alberta Bird Record Committee, hereafter the Committee. considered 108 records of rare birds newly documented in the province. With this review, the Official List of the Birds of Alberta grows by 5 species: Chimney Swift, Bar-tailed Godwit, Glossy Ibis, Eurasian Tree Sparrow and Orchard Oriole. The provincial list now stands at 438 species. This continues the trend of adding a species or two to the provincial list every year.

The Committee also reassessed the criteria for inclusion of a species on its <u>Review List</u> to focus on extreme rarities. The Committee will now seek documentation on species for which it has fewer than 16 accepted records, except for species, like the Band-tailed Pigeon, with fewer than two documented records in the last 10 years. As a result, the Committee now drops the following species from its Review List: Brant

(19 accepted records), Black Scoter (23), Sharp-tailed Sandpiper (19), Red Phalarope (17), Long-tailed Jaeger (21), Yellow-billed Loon (20), Snowy Egret (20), Western Bluebird (17) and Scarlet Tanager (16).

In the course of the past year one long-standing member of the Committee, Ray Wershler, stepped down, while Andrew Ross joined it. We are grateful for Ray's dedication to the Committee, notably for contributing many records and soliciting documentation on many others over the years, and for sharing the geographical breath of his expertise, which was unrivalled. Andrew comes to us with many years of experience birding in Alberta and Ontario.

The Official List is also amended to bring it in line with the 62nd and 63rd supplements to the American Ornithological Society's "Check-list of North American Birds" (Chesser et al. 2021, 2022) which have appeared since publication of our Thirteenth Report. The decisions include changes to the linear sequence of families in the Passeriformes, and of genera and species in the families Regulidae (kinglets) and Troglodytidae (wrens) resulting from new phylogenetic information. Recent changes also include the assignment of some species to new or different genera (Canachites canadensis [Spruce Grouse], Nannopterum auritum [Double-crested Cormorant] and Corthylio calendula [Ruby-crowned Kinglet]), changes to scientific names as a result of splits or lumps (Larus brachyrhynchus [Short-billed Gull], Caracara plancus [Crested Caracara] and Cistothorus stellaris [Sedge Wren]) and of a common name (Mew Gull becomes Shortbilled Gull).

#### CORRIGENDA

The Seventh Report of ABRC (Hudon et al. 2007) failed to mention the year when a Gray Flycatcher (*Empidonax wrightii*) appeared at Mount Lorette's "Hay Meadow." The bird was observed in 2005.

The Twelfth Report of the ABRC (Hudon et al. 2017) incorrectly placed Nacmine, where a Lesser Goldfinch (*Spinus psaltria*) was recorded, east of Drumheller when it is located west of that town.

## CODE DEFINITIONS

ACCEPTED, CODE 1. Records supported by material evidence, i.e., specimens, identifiable body parts, identifiable photographs or sound recordings, whose origin from within the borders of Alberta is in no doubt, that are accompanied by written reports of the circumstances of the observation.

ACCEPTED, CODE 2. Sight records (without supporting material evidence) by multiple observers that are supported by independent written descriptions that leave no doubt as to the species identity. A Code 1 or 2 sighting must receive four favourable votes and no more than one dissenting vote to be accepted.

ACCEPTED, CODE 3. Sight records by one or more observers that are supported by a single written description that leaves no doubt as to species identity, and which receive five favourable votes and no dissenting vote. A Code 3 is the minimum for inclusion in the official provincial list.

ACCEPTED, CODE 4. Sight records by single observers that receive four favourable votes and no more than one dissenting vote. For record adjudication purposes, such a record is acceptable, but does not pass the more stringent requirements for inclusion on the official provincial list. A list of species that have no higher than a Code 4 record may be published as an appendix to the official list.

#### IDENTIFICATION NOT ESTABLISHED.

Records supported by material evidence or written descriptions that are not detailed enough to eliminate all other possibilities, or to support conclusively the identification of the species as presented. Placement in this category should in no way be interpreted as a reflection on the veracity of the observation but should be looked upon as an encouragement to substantiate occurrence of the species in the province more fully.

ERROR IN IDENTIFICATION. Records where the documentation available to the committee runs counter to the stated identification, whether it identifies another species or not.

QUESTIONABLE ORIGIN. Records that concern species that are of questionable origin, possibly escapees, and whose wild status cannot be determined accurately.
